A solution, as described by Yamanaka, of iridium tetrachloride hydrate (4.5 mM), hydrogen peroxide (30% w/w), and oxalic acid dihydrate (0.5 g) in water was used. Anhydrous potassium carbonate was added to adjust pH to 10.5. The solution was then left standing at room temperature for 60 h until a deep blue-violet coloration appeared.
